**Taipei Incense Burning Culture in Transition:** A Fieldwork Study of the Conflict of Stop Burning Incense in the Hsing Tian

Kong

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**ABSTRACT** 

This research is to debate whether burning incense or not. Temple's culture is one

of the characteristics of Taiwan in which, local people go to temple to worship and

express their wish to gods, and foreign tourists go to temple of Taiwan to experience

our religious rituals. However, the development of urbanization and civilization are

shaping the local religious rituals, such as the promotion of environment protection and

best use of resources. In this research I take Taipei Hsing Tian Kong as example. It

banned the believers to burn incense in the temple at August, 26 2014, because the

smoke of incense is harmful to human body and environment. Hsing Tian Kong, one of

the representative temples in north Taiwan, conducts new regulation of worship. It

leads many believers to argue over stopping burning incense. In this research I want to

realize how people react to the change of traditional ritual, when living in the developed

society. I started the field work and in-depth-interview to approach my interviewees

and collect believers' perspective about stopping burning incense. My research finding

is that most people showed a compromising attitude on the policy of Hsing Tian Kong.

One accepts to stop burn compromising incense in public while continuing to burn

incense in private.
