From Ritual to Tourist Attraction: The Solo Travelers in Sumiyoshi Matsuri, Osaka

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Abstract

The Sumiyoshi Matsuri is a famous festival of Osaka with inheritance of traditional rituals and gorgeous scenes. The characters, songs, buildings and portable shrines that come into the ritual scene make you feel that you are in history. This paper tried to use the Sumiyoshi Matsuri as an example to explore how the solo travelers could find the attraction of such a festival.

Japanese Matsuri is for fun or entertainments to modern tourists. I expect that readers can learn from this paper that show how Japanese rituals of a local festival would become non-daily experiences. This research would also explain how solo travelers of different cultures and backgrounds would obtain joy and peace from the ritual. As such, the research object is the experience of travelers.
